Do Not Be Afraid

Everyone is afraid of something- rational or irrational; some are seemingly afraid of everything; and anybody that claims to be afraid of nothing is usually lying and might even fall into the "fears everything" category. Given these things, Rev.21:8, regarding cowardice, sounds harsh. After all, "I can't help it if I'm afraid of something, right?" Question: Haven't we read how many, many times Christians are urged, "Do not be afraid..."? I may not be able to help you with your fear of heights, storms, or clowns, but Christian, please don't be cowardly or afraid...

- To be different from the world. Jesus referred to the people of His day as sheep; but today, we also resemble chickens- they peck and destroy anyone that is different. As Christians, we're often far too afraid of being different. In 1Pet.2:9, peculiar doesn't mean odd, it means that Christians belong to God, and are thus distinct from the world in that way. But make no mistake about it: Truly belonging to God will also make you different from the world, 1Pet.4:1-6; 2Cor.6:14-18; Rev.18:1-5. Don't be cowardly- or afraid to think, feel, dress, speak, and act differently from the world! Don't be afraid to be different from the world! Being afraid to be different from the world leads to being afraid...
- To be considered backwards by the world. The world is constantly changing and "evolving" (according to the world, devolving according to me!), but you don't have to keep pace- God does not change, and neither does His Word! 1Cor.1:18-31; 2:1-5,10-16. If you respect God-ordained marriage, and fulfill your God-appointed roles and responsibilities as husbands/fathers, wives/mothers, the world will mock you as being backwards, ignorant, or at least unenlightened. Let them! Do not be afraid of what the world thinks of you, only what God thinks of you! The same is true of local congregations- the world's standards and expectations are not what is important. God's standards and expectations are the ones that matter! Do not be afraid to be considered backwards by the world. Fear of being considered backwards by the world leads to being afraid....
- To be hated/despised by the world. Darkness that loves darkness hates the light, John 3:19-20. Unbelievers are loved by the world, John 7:1-9. The world hated Jesus, and will hate and despise those who follow Him, John 15:18-19. This is just how it is, John 17:14. Get used to it, but don't worry or even be concerned about it. Such is not a cause for isolationism, 1Cor.5:9-10, and we still need to do everything within our power to reach out to and convert the world to Christ, but still yet must not let the world's hatred and rejection of Christ and us as His followers deter or concern us, Matt.10:14. Being afraid of the world hating and despising you leads to being afraid....
- To be unfriended by the world. Be careful when all (worldly) men speak well of you, <u>Luke 6:26</u>. While some people of character, and even slanderers, of the world may respect and have regard for you, cf. 1Tim.3:7; 1Pet.2:12, it is what God thinks of you that counts, <u>Luke 6:22-23</u>. Always remember that being friendly toward the world is very different from being a friend of the world, Jas.4:1-4.

Instead:

- Always be willing to stand for Truth, 1Tim.3:15! And when necessary,
- Be willing to suffer for righteousness, and rejoice in the name "Christian," even in persecution <u>1Pet.4:15-16!</u>
- The key is to trust God enough to be obedient regardless of the immediate or physical consequences, 1Pet.4:19.

Don't be afraid- be courageous!
