Sin's Separative Nature

Sin defined: Literally, a missing the mark, 1John 3:4 (Grk. hamartia).

Sin Separates:

- **Spouses**, <u>1Cor.7:10-11</u>; this is not God's intention or way, <u>vv.12-16</u>; Eph.5:25-33.
- Families, Luke 12:49-53; this is not what God desired, Eph.6:1-4; Luke 15:20-32.
- Friends, cf. Gal.2:11-14; Col.4:14 and Phile.24 with 2Tim.4:10; this is not what God wants, Prov.18:24; 27:10.
- **Brethren**, <u>1Cor.5:1-13</u>; <u>2Thess.3:6-14</u>; but such is not God's desire, Eph.4:1-3,31-32.

But most importantly, sin separates **us from God**, <u>Isa.59:1-2</u>; from His fellowship, <u>Gen.2 3:7-8,23-24</u>; His blessings, <u>1Pet.3:10-12</u>; from His salvation, <u>Rom.11:20-22</u>; but this is neither God's wish nor desire, <u>Matt.13:14-15</u>; <u>23:37-39</u>

Sin separates what God has joined (and desires to be) together.
