Idolatry Ancient and Modern

Idolatry, defined as "the worship of a physical object as a god" and "immoderate attachments or devotion to something," is first mentioned in Gen.31:17-19 when Rachel "stole the household idols" (Heb. teraphim) of her father Laban as she and Jacob departed. These typically seemed to be small representations of a god or gods that were either cast in precious metal, or carved and overlaid with it, Gen.30:22. They were apparently used as good luck charms, divination (contacting departed spirits), and/or a physical representation of supposed spiritual god(s) to whom worship/prayers were offered, Gen.31:30,34; 35:2-3. This tendency toward idolatry seems to have been associated with Abraham's family back in Ur (Lower Mesopotamia) and Haran (Paddan-Aram or Upper Mesopotamia), Gen.31:30,34; 35:2-3.

Thus, when the nation of Israel was "incorporated" from Abraham's family, God legislated against *idolatry* with the first commandment, <u>Ex.20:3</u>; and specifically against *graven images* with the second, <u>vv.4-5</u>. But the fledgling nation had also been exposed to rampant idolatry during its Egyptian experience (<u>Ex.12:37-40</u>), and soon after their exodus, returned to it, <u>Ex.32:1ff</u>. Despite God's prohibitions and explanations (<u>Isa.45:4-7</u>), Israel continuously *served* and *purged* idolatry, but never completely escaped its clutches…and the Gentile/heathen world openly embraced it, cf. Acts 17:16ff.

And yet, many believe in, submit to, and worship many 'gods'- both foreign and domestic today. We have our own idols- inherited from our ancestors, stolen from our fathers' households, borrowed or adapted from the nations around us, or created ourselves....

Consider our worship of and devotion to:

- Atheism- the notion that there is no god, and therefore no universal moral or spiritual law; no soul; and therefore no eternal existence- no heaven and no hell, cp. Ps.14:1 with Ps.19; Rom.1:18-22;
- Nature, Mysticism, Universal Consciousness, or some vague notion of the Spirit of the Universe- the acceptance and proclamation of a generic Higher Power, but without any appreciable knowledge, submission, or devotion to "It" (rather than Jehovah); these are nothing more than pure idolatry, and seek to worship and serve "the creature rather than the Creator," Rom.1:24-25; Isa.44:12-18,19; and,
- Allah, Buddha, or other Denominational Distortions of God- all share a tragic flaw in that they seek to *create a god* man desires instead of acknowledging and submitting to the God who created man, Phil.3:19; Isa.45:5-7.

But there are others that may not be considered as "Gods," but are submitted to and worshipped nonetheless:

Morality (the "Just be a good person/Follow your heart/do what is right for you" god)- the fallacy of this 'god' is that there is no real knowledge or standard of "good" without "God"- one can be kind to strangers and help the homeless and abort their own baby, cf. Rom.1:31 ("unloving," from astorgos- without natural

- affection); basic *morality*, without God, is merely derived from the mean/middle of the spectrum of *human thought* and *behavior*, cp. Jer.10:23-25;
- Money/Materialism- every economic model has its "Achilles' heel"- Capitalism's is that it promotes greed and the love/trust/idolization of money, cf. 1Tim.6:9-12; Matt.6:19-34;
- Pleasure/Recreation- though there is nothing wrong in and of itself with pleasure/recreation, it can easily become an idol; think about it, do you devote more time, energy, and resources to serving God, or recreation? "Ouch!" But think seriously and soberly about 1Tim.4:7-8; 1Cor.9:24-27; and Jas.4:1-4;
- Politic/Political-Social- in addition to idolatry (or perhaps just another form of it), ancient Israel's downfall is directly linked to trusting its own military might, and/or reliance on political treaties and alliances with other nations rather than God. Remember that it was the religious elites and politicos that rejected Jesus as the Messiah in the face of overwhelming affirming evidence, and then formulated a cover-up lie to conceal the truth from the people, Matt.28:11-15. And yet, many today love their nation, and are more concerned with and devoted to it more than with and to God, cf. John 11:47-48.
- Science/Technology- we've heard a lot about "science" and "technology" in the last couple of years. Remember <u>Jer.10:23-25</u> and realize that although science/technology has made tremendous strides, people "trusted the settled science" and "government" of their day and sprayed children with DDT, thought smoking was good for pregnant women, viewed asbestos as a life-saving wonder composition, and literally bled people to death because they said their blood was poisoned, <u>Rom.1:22</u>. "Trust the science/government"? How about let's trust THE God who cannot lie and is never wrong!

Conclusion:

It's easy (and convenient!) to disdainfully look with credulity upon ancient Israel's seemingly never-ending struggle with *idolatry*... until we take a really good and sobering look at ourselves, <u>cf. Rom.2:1</u>. *Idolatry* (putting anything before God) is still an abomination to Jehovah. May God forgive US! Acts 4:12
